2022 COMPETITION FORMAT

Infographic

- Focus on visuals, with some written content to complement the visuals
- You should aim to communicate your with the general public which may lack scientific background

Podcast/ 2 min. video

- Podcast:
 - 10 minutes max
 - Any format, ex Q and A style

- Video
 - o 2 mins max
 - O Aim for something that would be posted on social media: ex Tiktok, Instagram reel, etc
 - Be creative! Check out science social media accounts for inspiration

For both: target audience= general public lacking a scientific background

Literature Review

- 4 pages single-spaced max
- Citations not included in page limit
- Meant to see if you are able to explain your project to people within the scientific field

Theme

SCIENCE AND DIVERSITY

Examples

- Diversity of ecosystems
- Lack of diversity in scientific positions of power, scientific research
- Cell diversity
- Microbial diversity
- Focus not on giving a general overview of the topic, but on perhaps a new specific finding, or something you want to advocate for
